The Sol Scholarship is founded on an agreement between Sol and The University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus with the aim of providing funding for high performing students across the campuses of the University of the West Indies including Cave Hill, Mona, St. Augustine and the Open Campus.

Among the Primary Criteria, selected students are required to meet the following:

- i. At the Undergraduate Level, applicant must have completed the first year of programme. This is not relevant to the Masters or PhD Programmes.
- ii. Applicant must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- iii. Applicant must be a citizen of the OECS, CARICOM, or any Sol territories not represented in these aforementioned groups.
- iv. Applicants must be studying within the Science or Social Science disciplines
- v. Applicant should demonstrate leadership in their work or community sphere.
- vi. Applicant should demonstrate a financial need for the additional funding.
- vii. Applicant must complete and submit the Sol Scholarship Form by relevant deadline each year.

These students will in turn represent a high caliber of human resources required within the evolving energy sector and the wider streams of business.
